Recyclables are collected single stream—no need to separate your recyclable items. **NO Styrofoam or plastic bags.**



Trash barrels, up to two 32-gallons.

One oversized item per week (no metal furniture or appliances)

Answers to the Top 6 Questions

- My trash wasn't picked up.**
Call Republic Services Customer Service at 800-442-9006.
- My recycling wasn't picked up.** Call Waste Management Customer Service at 800-972-4545.
- What do I do with TVs, electronics, appliances, tires, and large metal items?**
Call Republic Services at 800-442-9006 to schedule a pickup. **Note: Fees** will be charged based on item.
- What do I do with **bulky or oversized items**, such as a couch?
One item per week per household can be placed at curbside. Items include tables, couches, chairs and mattresses. **Consider donating** items if in good condition. See page 3.
- Can I put **Styrofoam** in my recycling?
NO Styrofoam in recycling, it contaminates sorted recyclables. Take the challenge to minimize Styrofoam use!
- Can I put **plastic bags** in my recycling?
NO plastic bags in recycling, they damage the sorting machines. Bring plastic bags to grocery stores, Lowes or other stores that recycle plastic bags.

Did you know?

- The average amount of garbage/trash produced per person in the U.S. is 30.1 pounds a week.
- Annually, 85% of textiles are NOT donated or recycled. Donate your textiles and keep them out of the trash. Simple Recycling will pick up textiles and other household goods curbside on your recycle day See page 3.

Tips for Successful Recycling

- CLEAN beverage and food from containers
- Remove straws, plastic liners and plastic bags
- Empty and flatten items to make more room in the truck for collection
- Plastic recycling numbers can be located on the bottom or edges of plastic items

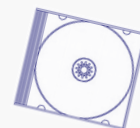
Some reminders:

Textile Recycling

Simple Recycling offers free Curbside Clothing and Home Goods

Simple Recycling will pick up textile items curbside on recycling days. A textile is any item made from cloth or an artificial fabric like vinyl. Any of these textiles even if it is worn, stained or torn, can be recycled but need to be clean and dry.

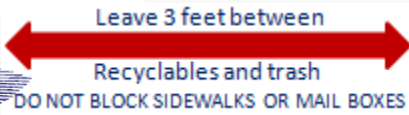
- Clothing/shoes, Accessories such as Handbags, Jewelry
- Pots, Pans, Dishes, Silverware
- Curtains, Upholstery, Carpets
- Linens such as Bedding, Tablecloths, towels, pillows
- Backpacks



Residents received pink bags in the mail for their recycled items then set their bags out on their recycling collection day. Simple Recycling drivers pick up the pink bags and leave replacement ones with recycling barrel. 866-835-5068

Guidelines for RECYCLING and TRASH

RECYCLING



TRASH

Limit: NONE—put out as much recycling as you like!

Time: At curb by **6:30 AM**, every other week on your trash day. See calendar.

Recyclables: See page 2 for items.

Containers: Should weigh 50 lbs. or less. Options include:

1. Trash barrels (up to 64 gallons) with recycling stickers (free from Recycling Office), and/or
2. Recycle bins (free from Recycling Office).

Requirements:

- **ALL recyclables** can go in the same container—no need to sort, but you can if you want to!
- **Corrugated cardboard** should be flattened, cut to 3'x3' and place in, under or between recycling containers.

Limit: TWO 32-gallon barrels/bags, 1 oversized/ bulky item

- Town overflow bags are available for a fee at:
 - Agway, Maple Road
 - Chelmsford Lumber, Boston Road
 - Hannaford, Drum Hill
 - Stop & Shop, Chelmsford Street
 - Walgreens, Chelmsford Street

Time: At curb by **6:30 AM** every week

Containers: Barrels/bags up to 32-gallons. The trash collection company is not required to empty containers larger than 32-gallons.

Requirements:

- Barrels/bags cannot weigh over 50 lbs
- Barrels must not be filled over 3 inches from top

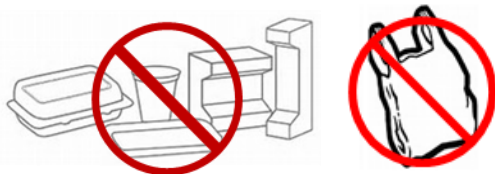
Oversized/Bulky Items:

- Tables, couches, chairs, and mattresses
- No banned items (see below)

BANNED from RECYCLING



- × **NO STYROFOAM**
- × **NO PLASTIC BAGS**



- × They are a major litter problem.
- × They are made from non-renewable fossil fuels
- × They jam sorting machines and contaminate sorted recyclables at recycling facilities



BANNED from TRASH

- × Batteries-Rechargeable and Button—drop off in boxes at Town Office, lower level. Alkaline batteries go in trash. Bring vehicle batteries to Household Hazardous Waste event or call DPW office 978-250-5203.
- × Cardboard—recycle it!
- × Cell phones, MP players, PDAs—drop off in boxes at Town Office, lower level.
- × Construction/demolition debris—for disposal options, see page 7; for donation options see page 5.
- × Electronics, TVs, tires, appliances, large metal items (grills, lawn mowers, snow blowers, car parts, exercise equipment, etc.)—call Republic Services, 800-442-9006 for fee-based curbside collection.
- × Medical sharps—see calendar and page 6.
- × Yard waste (leaves, grass, brush, etc.)—see page 7.

- Do not block sidewalks or mail boxes
- Leave 3' between recyclables and trash

HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Household hazardous waste includes common household items that contain *toxic* chemicals. Products, such as paints, cleaners, oils, batteries, pesticides and similar products can contain hazardous ingredients and need to be handled properly.

Fees may be charged for these items—call for more information about these or other items.

- Antifreeze
- Batteries—lithium, rechargeable, vehicle (e.g., car, boat, etc.) (alkaline batteries can go in the trash)
- Brake fluid
- Degreasers
- Drain openers, oven cleaners
- Driveway sealers
- Epoxies, adhesives
- Fertilizers, fungicides, herbicides, pesticides, weed killers
- Hobby/photography chemicals
- Metal or furniture polish
- Oil paint, paint thinner, solvents, stains, varnishes, wood strippers and preservatives
- Transmission fluid
- Motor oil
- Pool chemicals
- Rodent poisons



Missed Chelmsford's Hazardous Waste Collection Day?

Chelmsford residents can drop off items at the Lexington event. Avoid the \$35 fee by pre-registering with the Chelmsford Recycling Office, 978-250-5203, at least one week in advance.

MERCURY

Mercury is toxic. State law prohibits the disposal of mercury and mercury added products in the trash.

- Blood pressure cuffs contain mercury
- Button batteries—bring to Recycling Office
- Devices with backlit screens, such as hand held video games, portable DVD players, etc.
- Electrical switches—bring to Recycling Office or Board of Health to receive a FREE digital thermometer replacement while supplies last
- Flat panel computer monitors and TVs—call Republic Services, 800-442-9006, for fee-based collection
- Fluorescent and neon bulbs—bring to light bulb shed behind Town Hall, open first Wednesday of every month, April-November
- Mercury thermometers and thermostats—bring to Board of Health to receive a FREE digital thermometer replacement while supplies last

For Elemental mercury and other mercury devices, call the Recycling Office, 978-250-5203.



MEDICAL WASTE

Sharps Disposal Collection

Board of Health—preregister 2 weeks prior
Sep 12, 2018; Dec 12, 2018; Apr 10, 2019

- Needles, syringes with needles
- Lancets
- Empty or full EpiPens



PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

Seal unused pills (no needles or liquid) in plastic baggie and drop off (no questions asked) in the disposal box at the Chelmsford Police Station. Available 24/7.

YARD WASTE and CONSTRUCTION/DEMOLITION DEBRIS



YARD WASTE

- Do not dispose on Town owned land or wetlands
- Brush may be burned with a permit

- Make your own wood chips—buy, borrow or rent a chipper (Taylor Rental, call 978-937-5544)
- Christmas trees Sign-up in advance for pick-up for a donation by Boy Scout Troop 70 (978-761-4536 or www.troopseventy.com) or take to Community Tree (see above) for a donation to the Scouts.

Free Town Brush Drop-off

- 6" diameter x 8' long
- No box trucks
- Rope, wire, bags etc. must be removed by resident
- Community Tree accepts brush all year for a FEE

BANNED from Trash: Leaves and Grass Clippings

- Jones Farm, 246 Acton Rd, 978-256-8065
Fee based leaf collection/drop-off;
leaves **must be** in **Jones Farm bags**
- Contact a local landscaper to remove leaves
- Compost leaves and grass clippings, add kitchen scraps = great FREE compost!
- Leave grass clippings on the lawn, check out the Mass.gov website for more information.
- **Free** drop off for leaves and grass in paper yard waste bags at the DPW 9 Alpha Rd. Nov. 17th 2018 and May 18th 2019 9am-3pm

LATEX PAINT

- Open lid and let paint dry completely
- Use kitty litter to absorb paint
- Place up to 5 cans/week with lids off next to trash for collection

Bring oil paints, thinners, solvents, stains, varnishes, and paint strippers to the Household Hazardous Waste drop-off (see page 6).



CONSTRUCTION/DEMOLITION DEBRIS

- Debris from home improvement projects and house clean outs
- Trash exceeds curbside pickup requirements
- Republic Services, call 800-442-9006, for vendor preferred pricing or dumpster rental for Chelmsford residents



- Carpet—3' strips, tied/taped into rolls up to 12" diameter, 5 rolls per week at curbside
- Fire extinguishers—Fire and Safety Corp, Tyngsboro, 978-649-4945
- Large metal items/appliances—Republic Services, 800-442-9006, fee-based
- Smoke/carbon monoxide detectors—remove batteries, dispose in trash
- Tires—Republic Services, 800-442-9006, fee-based
- Toilets, tubs, showers—remove toilet tank from seat (if possible), cut tub/shower into pieces (if possible)
- Windows—cover glass with tape completely on both sides, dispose in trash, 3 windows per week

ABCs of BATTERIES

- **A**lkaline (e.g., toy, flashlight)—Trash
- **B**utton, rechargeable, lithium—bring to Recycling Office; Staples recycles rechargeable batteries
- **C**ar, boat, sealed lead acid batteries—Household Hazardous Waste Collection or call DPW, 978-250-5203

Waste Reduction and Recycling at Multi-family Properties:

Multi-family properties with dumpsters and toters:

- 64-gallon toter or barrel per unit per week.
- Extra pick-ups paid for by property owner/manager—make sure that doesn't happen, RECYCLE!
- Prepare recyclables according to instructions on page 4 (cardboard boxes MUST be flattened).
- Never park in front of trash or recycling dumpsters, toters, or barrels.
- NO STYROFOAM and NO PLASTIC BAGS in recycling!

Multi-family properties with curbside collection:

- Set trash out separately from other units (trash hauler can see you're within the limits).

Republic Services will collect appliances and other large metal items, electronics and tires at the curb for a fee every two weeks.

[1-800-442-9006](tel:1-800-442-9006) up to 5:00 p.m. the Friday before collection day every other Tuesday. Payment must be made in advance (credit card, check or money order) to Republic Services, 385 Dunstable Road, Tyngsboro, MA 01879. Once payment is processed it will not be refunded. Items must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on collection day. To avoid breakage by vandals do NOT put TVs out until the morning scheduled for collection.

Prices for July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019:

- Large metal items and appliances without freon : \$20.00
- Appliances with Freon (refrigerators, freezers, ACs, etc.): \$30.00
- CRTs/TVs/monitors: up to 25" \$25.00; over 24" \$40.00
- Console TVs \$50.00 Projection TVs \$57.50
- Small Electronics & Tires: \$6.00 each
- Flat Screen up to 30" \$25.00
- Flat Screen over to 30" \$35.00
- Plasma TV any size \$50.00
