Chelmsford Conservation Land Use Restrictions **Adopted October 23, 2007**

The following Use restrictions apply to all on reservations and land under the jurisdiction of the Chelmsford Conservation Commission pursuant to Mass General Laws, Section 40.c

- A. Reservations are open during daylight hours.
- B. No person shall build a fire for any purpose without Conservation Commission and Fire Department written permission.
- C. No alcoholic beverages.
- D. Unauthorized cutting, mutilating, removing or taking away of trees, shrubs, and flowers or wood is prohibited.
- E. Disorderly conduct or obscene or indecent behavior is prohibited.
- F. No person shall remove or deface any sign posted on property or remove barriers on roads or erect any structures.
- G. Persons using these reservations do so at their own risk and must observe any reasonable request made by the Conservation Commission or its duly authorized agent.
- H. No person shall carry on any business or commercial calling or trade or sell or otherwise deal in commodities or merchandise without Conservation Commission written permission.
- I. No hunting or trapping without Conservation Commission written permission.
- J. No person shall carry or discharge weapons, except duly authorized law enforcement personnel.

- K. The use of any motorized vehicles, except those authorized by the Conservation Commission or those used by the Police and/or Fire Department, shall be prohibited.
- L. No person shall camp or remain overnight on conservation land without the written consent of the Conservation Commission.
- M. No dumping
- N. Whoever violates any provision of the article shall be punished by a fine of \$100 for the first offense, \$200 for the second offense, and \$300 for the third and any subsequent offense. Any violator of the Dumping provision of the Use Restrictions who fails to remove any of the items so dumped after being duly notified by the Conservation Commission or its duly authorized agent to remove the same shall be subject to a fine. Each day any or all of said items remaining after issuance of such notification to the violator shall be a separate offense. Violators may be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.
