SUMMARY Christine Clancy serves as the DPW Commissioner for the Lowell Department of Public Works which is comprised of 10 divisions including Administration and Finance, Engineering, Solid Waste and Recycling, Lands and Building (Facilities), Electrical, Streets, Parks, Cemeteries, Water, and Wastewater. Prior to joining the City of Lowell, Ms. Clancy was a project manager and a civil engineer specializing in the planning, design, and construction management of utility infrastructure projects for urban municipalities.

Manage a staff of approximately 150 employees across 10 divisions including Administration and Finance, Engineering, Solid Waste and Recycling, Lands and Buildings, Electrical, Streets, Parks, Cemeteries, Water, and Wastewater. Develop, implement, and manage an annual DPW (excluding water and wastewater) operations budget of approximately \$18 million and a capital budget of \$34.5 million. Manage and coordinate with division heads and staff to successfully operate the DPW. Oversee the review and development of vendor, snow management, and project contracts and requests for proposals in accordance with public bidding requirements; maintenance and repair of 235 miles of roadways and sidewalks; maintenance and repair of traffic signals and lights across the City; maintenance and repair of 66 City-owned buildings, of which 30 are public school buildings; maintenance and operation of 92 parks, 6 City-owned cemeteries, and public shade trees; maintenance of and repairs to the DPW fleet; deployment of City and contractor plows and salting fleet for winter storm events; collection and disposal of solid waste, recycling, and yard waste to the residents of Lowell; provision of safe drinking water to the residents of Lowell; and maintenance of and improvements to the collection, treatment, and disposal of sewerage and stormwater. Serve as the tree warden for the City. Provide necessary support and continued communication across various City departments and to other stakeholders, including regular updates and City Council motion responses directly to the City Manager's office.

Oversaw the design and construction administration services for infrastructure projects within the public right-of-way and the maintenance of an infrastructure rating database which includes pavement condition ratings and bridge inspection reports. Reviewed and issued approximately 1000 annual street opening, trench, and dumpster permits. Completed residential and commercial plan reviews for the planning board, zoning board, and Conservation Commission. Coordinated with the Wastewater Department on stormwater reviews for residential and commercial projects. Provided planning and design support to the DPW and other City Departments and prepared construction and City Council motion updates for the DPW Commissioner.
