Boyd has announced that all applicants for the Tercentenary seal design contest must submit their copy by July 15 at the latest. The seal of the town of Chelmsford must be incorporated in the Tercentenary seal, and the following rules must be complied with: All entries must be on No. 73 Strathmore drawing board, high surface, three sheet, or Bristol board. All entries must have the name and street address of the participant on the back of his or her entry. The first prize will be a 25 dollar bond, and there will be six honorable mentions. 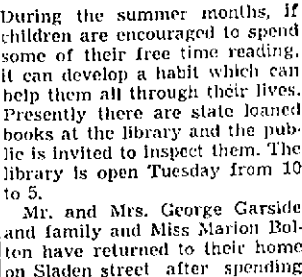
